WORKS_ON (Essn, Pno, Hours)
DEPENDENT (Essn, Dependent_name, Bdate, Relationship)
```

Give an expression in SQL to express each of the following queries:

a. Increase the salary of employees who works on the project 'LIFELINE-2020' by 20% and all others by 10%.

b. Assign the project "PRODUCT-X" (PNO=111) to employees of research department.

c. Remove all the dependents of age above 21 as on date.

```
DELETE FROM Dependent
WHERE YEAR((SELECT sysdate FROM dual) - Bdate) = 21;
```

2. Create a view that has the employee last name, project name, and hours per week for each employee working on a project.

```


b. Delete

```


c. Update

```


3. ArtBase Galleries keep information about artists, their names (which are unique), birthplaces, age, and style of art. For each piece of artwork, the artist, the year it was made, its unique title, its type of art (e.g., painting, lithograph, sculpture, photograph), and its price must be stored. Pieces of artwork are also classified into groups of various kinds, for example, portraits, still lifes, works by Picasso, or works of the 19th century; a given piece may belong to more than one group. Each group is identified by a name (like those just given) that describes the group. Finally, galleries keep information about customers. For each customer, galleries keep that person's unique name, address, total amount of dollars spent in the gallery (very important!), and the artists and groups of art that the customer tends to like. Draw the ER diagram for the database. State clearly any assumptions you make.



4. Design an ER schema for keeping track of information about votes taken in the U.S.House of Representatives during the current two-year congressional session. The database needs to keep track of each U.S. STATE's Name (e.g., 'Texas', 'New York', 'California') and include the Region of the state (whose domain is {'Northeast', 'Midwest', 'Southeast', 'Southwest', 'West'}). Each CONGRESS_PERSON in the House of Representatives is described by his or her Name, plus the District represented, the Start_date when the congressperson was first elected, and the political Party to which he or she belongs (whose domain is {'Republican', 'Democrat', 'Independent', 'Other'}). The database keeps track of each BILL (i.e., proposed law), including the Bill_name, the Date_of_vote on the bill, whether the bill Passed_or_failed (whose domain is {'Yes', 'No'}), and the Sponsor (the congressperson(s) who sponsored—that is, proposed—the bill). The database also keeps track of how each congressperson voted on each bill (domain of Vote attribute is {'Yes', 'No', 'Abstain', 'Absent'}). Draw an ER schema diagram for this application. State clearly any assumptions you make.
